

## SLIM MAN CDs

### **Thousand Miles Away (2010)**

This is the first new Slim Man CD in four years.

This CD features eleven incredible original songs, plus a bonus track from the upcoming "Slim Man Live" CD. 'Thousand Miles Away' also features the stunning guitar work of the Master from Madrid, Marc Antoine (Sting, Madonna, Shakira).



### **Christmas Eve (2008)**

This Slim Christmas CD features a scintillating vocal duet with Antonia Bennett (Tony's daughter) on 'Baby, It's Cold Outside', as well as seven Christmas classics and three new original holiday songs. JazzTrax calls it "...one of the best Christmas CDs released this year."



### **Solstice (2006)**

Solstice has a pop/latin/chill vibe, and the first single 'Secrets of Your Heart' was a Top Ten hit on Internet Jazz Radio. Has a compelling and unique version of 'If I Were a Carpenter'. smoothjazz.com calls it "...truly outstanding."



### **Bella Mia (2005)**

A Best of Slim Man done live in the studio. Also released in Germany to critical acclaim, Strictly Jazz Magazine calls it "refreshingly original, his vocals show a lot of depth and emotion."



### **For Now and Forever (2003)**

A collection of American Pop Standards featuring the Slim Man band in full effect. Includes 'Summer Wind', 'Route 66' and eight other classics. contemporaryjazz.com says of this CD "...sophisticated delivery, compelling instrumentalists, grade A."

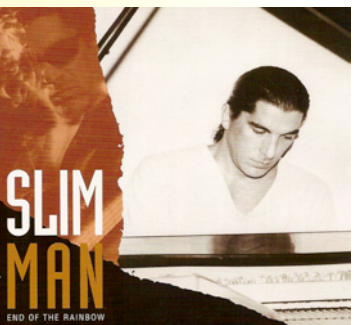


### **All I Want for Christmas (2000)**

The first Slim Man Christmas CD, which features Peter White, Freddie Ravel, Ken Navarro, and Randy Brecker. Has ten classic Holiday Favorites as well as two new Slim Man original songs.

### **jazzified (1999)**

This CD was named Best Contemporary Jazz CD in the 2001 JAZZIZ Readers Poll. Need we say more?



### **Secret Rendezvous (1997)**

This CD has a lot of guest Smooth Jazz artists like Rick Braun, Marc Antoine, Chieli Minucci and Everette Harp. It was named Top Ten of 1997 by Smooth Jazz and Leisure Magazine. Who was number 11? Kenny G!

### **Closer to Paradise (1996)**

Includes the Top Twenty Hit 'There for You' as well as the classic 'Valentine's Day'. Gavin Magazine says of the CD "...a definite step up." Whatever that means...

### **End of the Rainbow (1995)**

The Big Debut, featuring the Top Ten Hit 'Faith In Us'. J.D. Considine of Rolling Stone calls it "...a near-perfect example of how jazz and soul can be combined as pop."
